In New York

As of March 30, 2021, New Yorkers aged 30 or older will be eligible for COVID-19 vaccination! For more information or to find a vaccination center, visit nyc.gov/vaccinefinder. To schedule an appointment at a NYC Department of Health Center or NYC Health + Hospitals, eligible New Yorkers can call 877-829-

4692.
As of April 6, residents of New York from age 16 will also be eligible to receive the COVID-19, vaccine.

In New Jersey

As of March 29, vaccine eligibility has expanded to new groups of essential workers. On April 5, eligibility will expand to include additional essential workers, individuals age 55+, and individuals age 16+ with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

As of March 30, 2021, New Yorkers age 30 or older are now eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine!

Starting April 6, New York residents age 16 and older will also become eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine.

- First responders and support staff Food industry workers, including grocery store and restaurant work
 Public-facing government and not-for-profit workers
 Health care workers
